Session #4 | Workshop: Introduction to the 4EU+ Quality
Management System chaired by Swantje Schirmer, 4EU+ quality
referee, and the 4EU+ QMS group

The session seeks to provide participants with a broad overview on quality management on an alliance-level, its implementation on the university-level and aims to incite initial reflections on potential synergies between quality management and higher education didactics, teaching and learning. To do so, participants will receive an introduction to 4EU+QUALITY, the quality management system of 4EU+, its normative foundations and concrete procedures, that is initial certification, internal auditing and external reviewing. This overview will be deepened by two university-perspective from the alliance on the implementation of this system into their existing local quality management systems.
